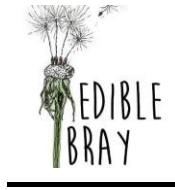


# *Edible Bray*

Monthly Growing Guide - September 2023



Autumn is approaching. *September* is a time to harvest the last of summer's bounty and prepare for winter and spring.

## **Sowing Outdoors Into Soil Or Containers.**

*Winter/Spring greens, mustard, oriental vegetables, spinach, turnips and green manures to cover bare patches and dig in during the winter or spring. Garlic, onion seeds, broad beans and peas may be sown now for an early crop next year.*

## **Sowing Indoors In Pots Or Trays**

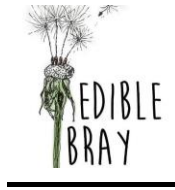
*Kale, cabbage, broccoli, oriental vegetables, cauliflower.*

## **Planting Out**

*Winter and Spring greens that were sown indoors in August, overwintering onion sets and new strawberry runners in pots or beds.*

## **Tasks.**

- *Water and feed all of your sowings and plants regularly, especially squashes and pumpkins. Collect rainwater for garden use.*
- *Weed all planted areas regularly.*
- *Check ,Clean and Sharpen Tools.*
- *Continue organic Wildlife Management Measures. Use no chemicals.*
- *Feed and water all containers regularly.*
- *Use net, cloches or fleece to protect brassica from birds.*
- *Cut back old berry canes and prune currant bushes.*

## **Harvesting**

*Parsnips, potatoes, raspberries, blackberries, apples, pears, radishes, courgettes, tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers and salad crops.*
